Tarazona

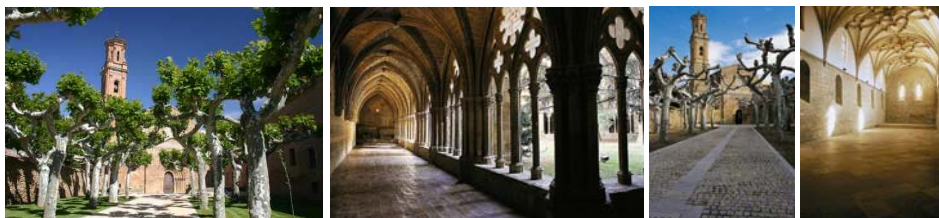
